A difficult time

Holy Week is a difficult time for us. It is difficult because of the number of points of celebration. It is difficult because of the seriousness of the themes of betrayal and death. And it is difficult because people are becoming more and more busy in their ordinary lives and so don't have the time to enter into this occasion seriously.

It is important to make this week a special time of prayer and reflection. We do this at a community level by gathering in big numbers five times in the week. But we need to do it at a family level as well, and at a personal level also. This is the week when Lenten penance should be exercised in a special way by taking this time to journey with Jesus and so catch his Spirit.

Stages of the Journey

- 1. Palm Sunday:** *From being celebrated to being forgotten.*
- 2. Holy Thursday:** *From giving himself to his disciples in the Eucharist to being denied by them.*
- 3. Good Friday:** *From surrendering himself to God's will to feeling abandoned even by God in death.*
- 4. Holy Saturday:** *From complete emptiness in death to new life.*
- 5. Easter Sunday:** *From the tomb to the ends of the earth.*

During this Holy Week we journey through all these stages with Jesus so that he may bring us to new life and hope.

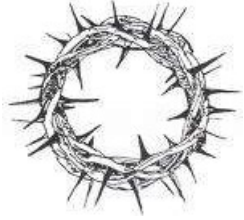

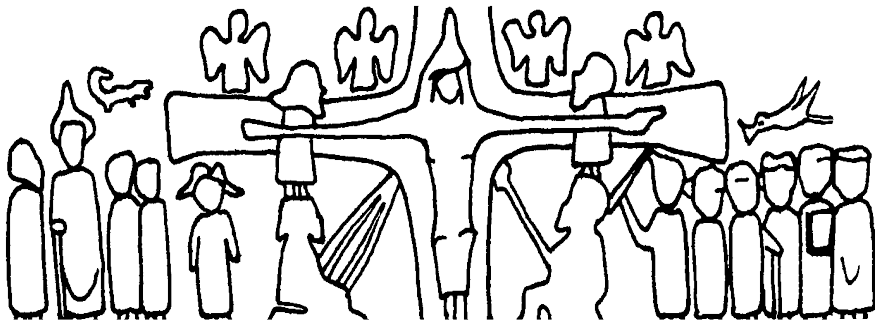

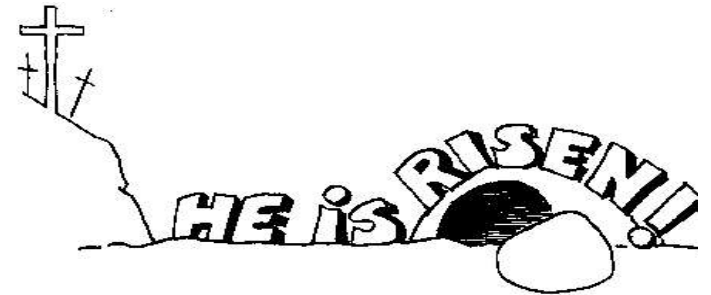
