We ask you to use the Sanitiser Spray as you enter the Church and also when leaving the Church. A Church Door will be left open at all times so as to avoid the need to open and close doors.

To enable us to do this we need your help in establishing a rota of cleaners so that the accessible areas in the church can be cleaned/sanitised every day.
